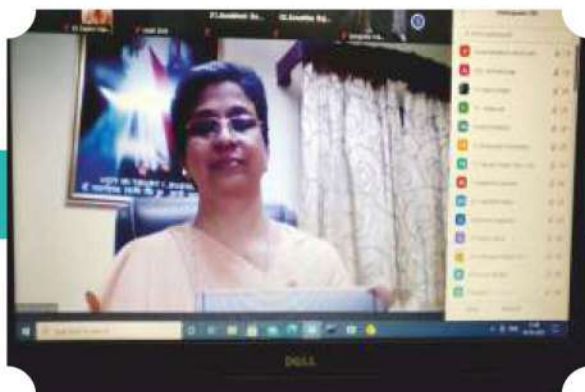

The festival of Dussehra was celebrated Virtually with great religious zeal and fervour. The students attired themselves as characters of Ramayana and enacted scene from the epic.

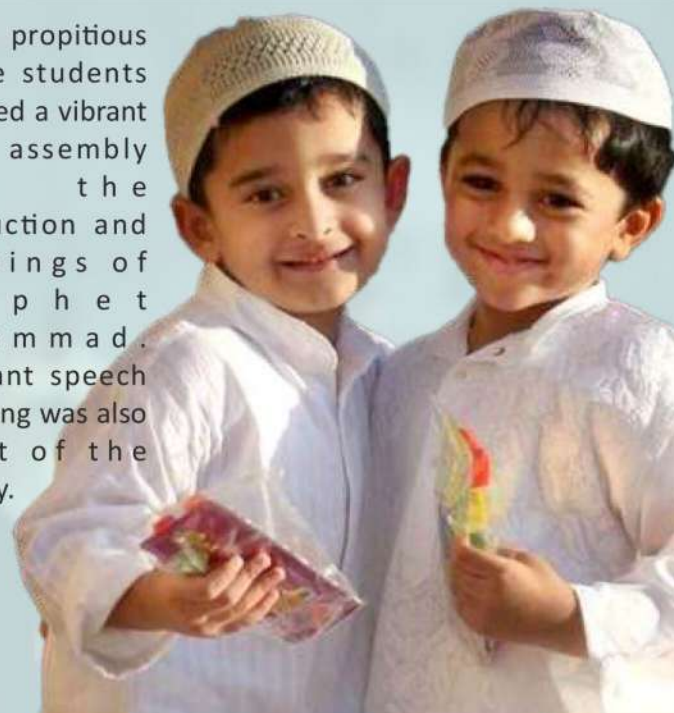


30 October 2020 Eid-E-Milad

Further Rev. Sr. elaborately explained five principles of UMI pedagogy-

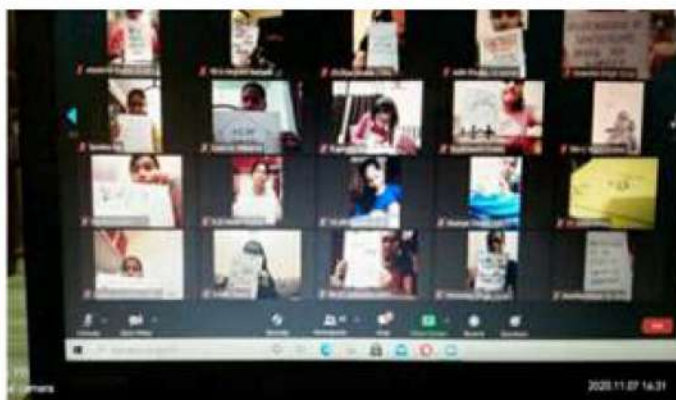
Contemplation of the context, conscience formation, education of the heart, faith formation and upliftment of the poor and the marginalized.

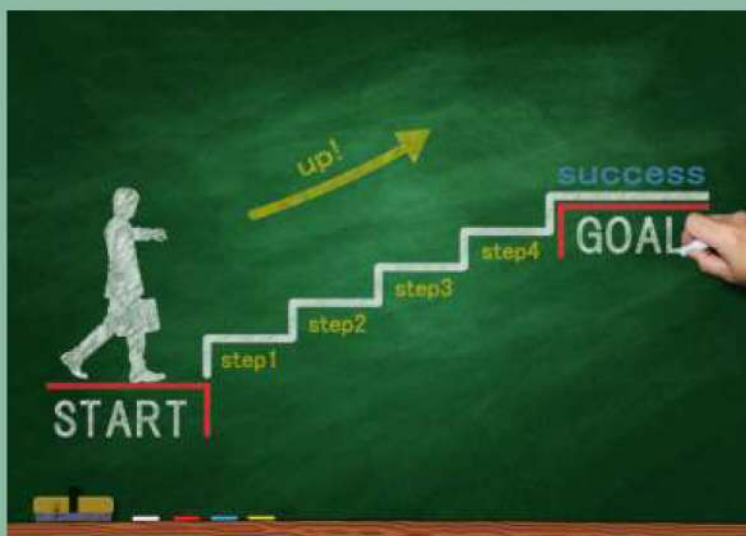


Aspirations For 11th Grade

MOTHER GIOVANNA ALBERONI

Former superior general of UMI, was the first nun to pursue medical studies in India. A true missionary, she left her native Italy and placed herself selflessly at the service of humanity. She worked tirelessly for the growth of Indian mission. As a medical doctor her kindness and compassion to the sick was exceptional. She helped more than 1000 of poor children to gain education. Known as a "singing nun" for her lovely voice, "the motorcycle nun" for speeding around on a lambretta in Delhi in the 50's and 60's and the sister with the 'sunshine smile mother', Mother Giovanna's enthusiasm for healing and institution building was embedded in her seven decades of service in Ursuline's mission across India. In October 1960 Mother Giovanna Alberoni was sent on her first mission to the Mariampur hospital in Kanpur, UP where she organised open air clinic for poor villages in the remote areas in and around Kanpur who could not go to the hospital OPD. Her mission was marked by her indomitable spirit and deep trust in divine providence. Having serving the lord faithfully Mother Giovanna Alberoni left for the heavenly abode at the age of 93.

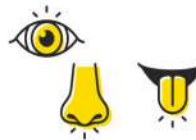
डॉक्टर से तुरंत संपर्क करने से बीमारी को बुराआत में ही पकड़ा जा सकता है।
